Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Monday, February 17th to Monday, March 3rd, 2025, among a sample of 988 Registered Voters, 18 years of age or older, living in Florida. The survey was conducted with text messaging. The survey gave respondents the option to complete the survey in English and Spanish. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Florida. Weights are applied for Gender, Race, Education and Past vote. Party ID is determined by asking which party each respondent most identifies with, as some states do not have voter registration by party. All voters are asked how likely they are to vote, and the voters who say they are most likely to vote are added to the Likely Voter screen.

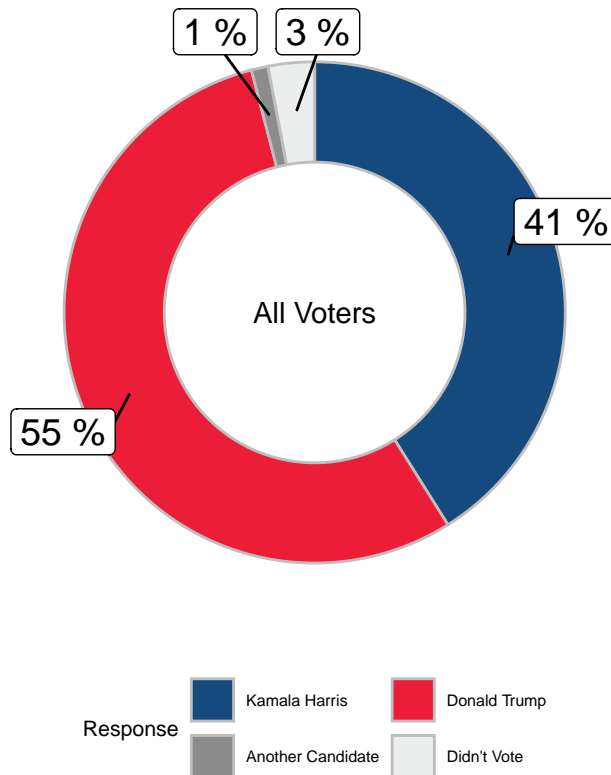
The margin of error for the poll is +/- 3.1% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

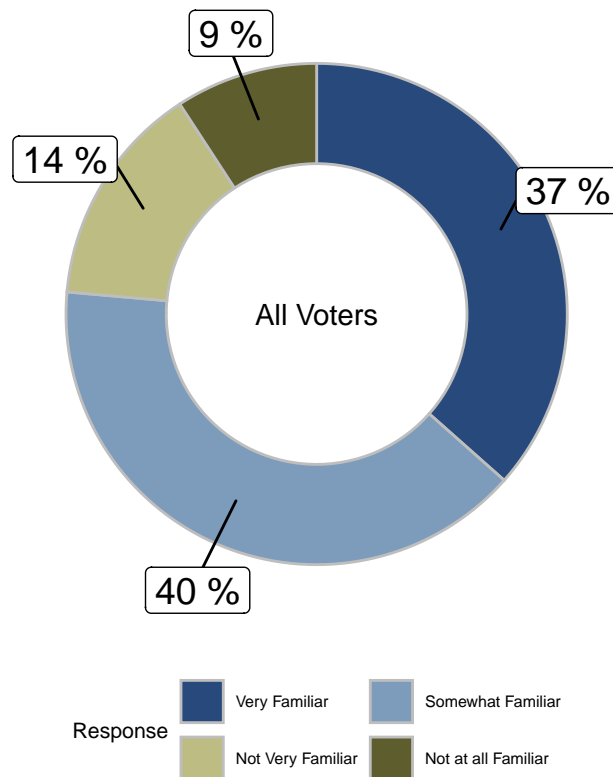

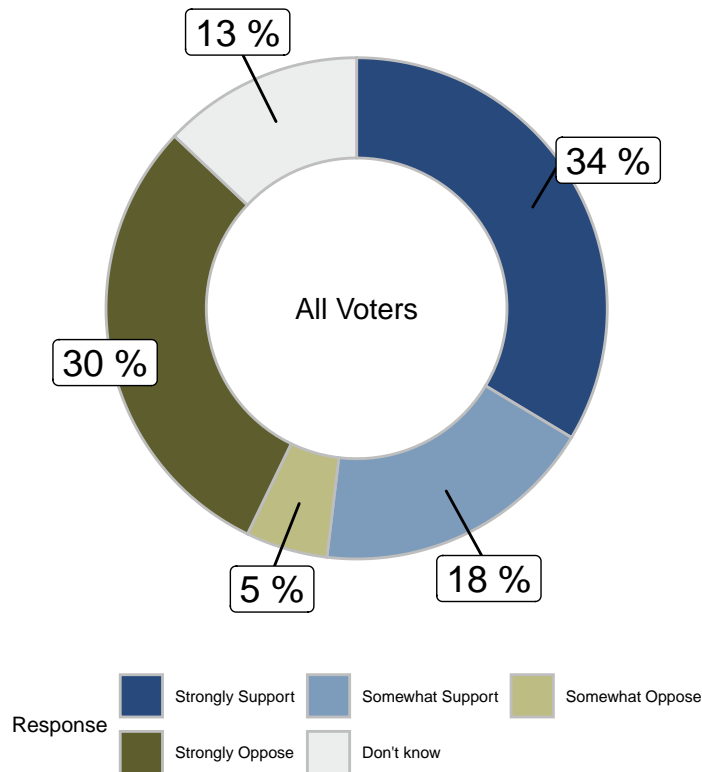

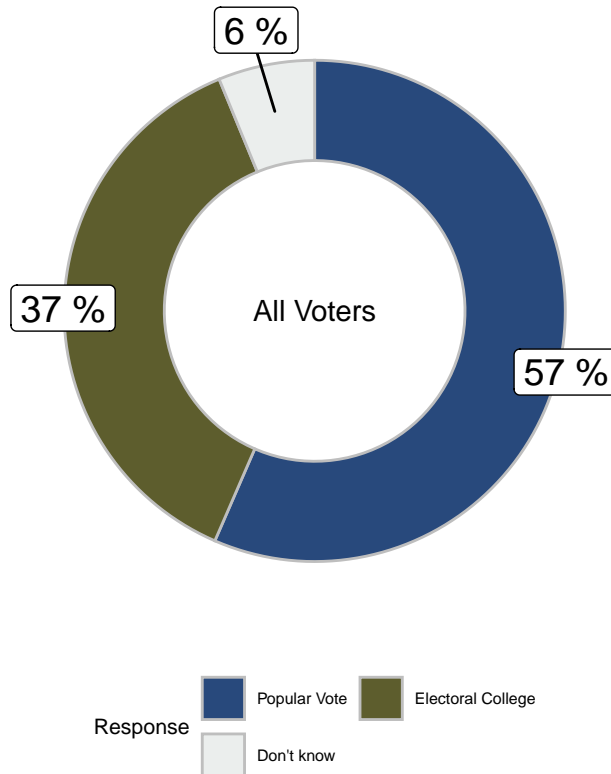

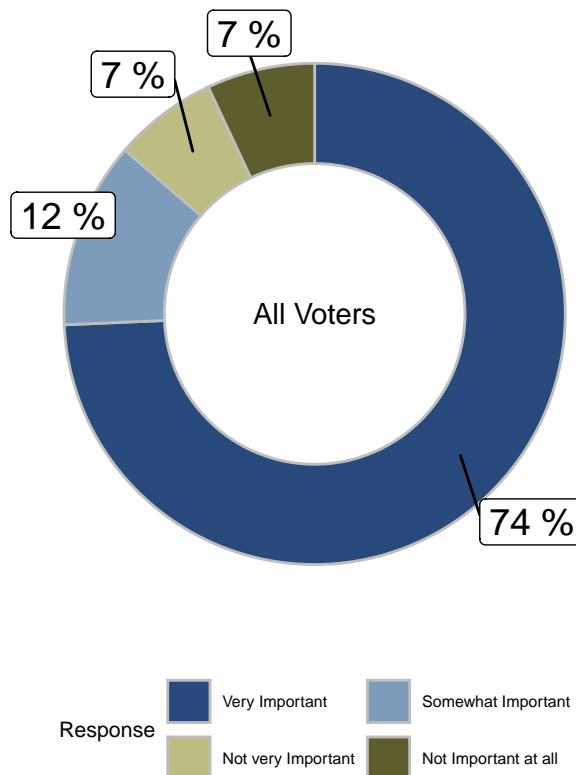

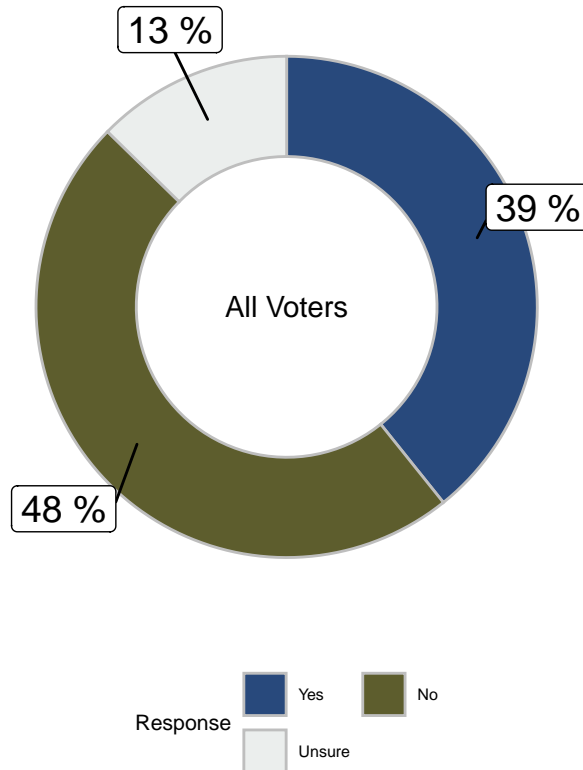

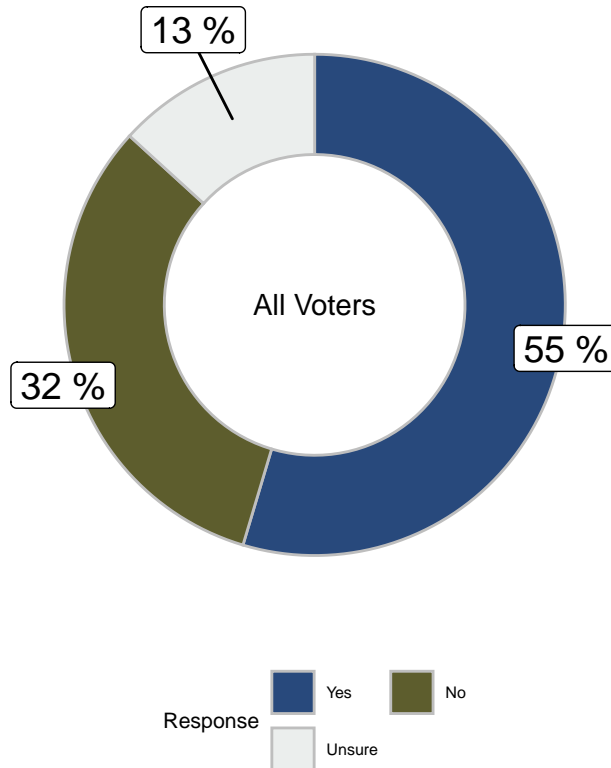

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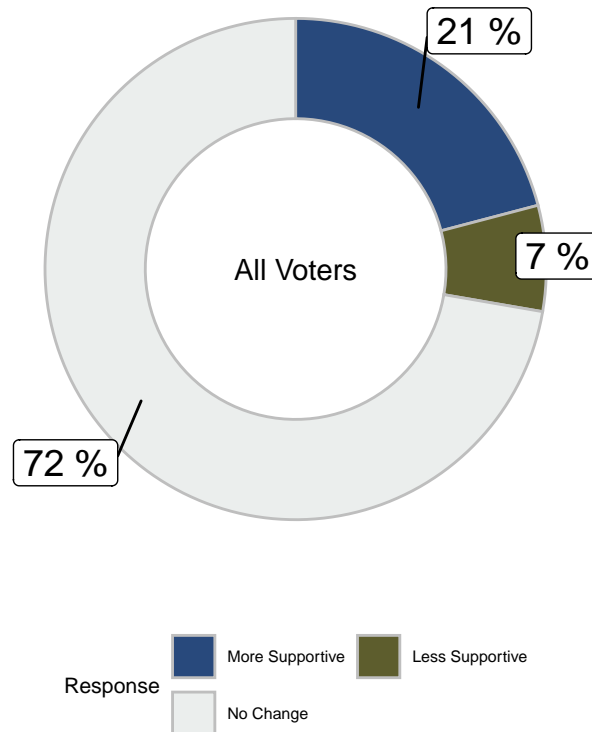

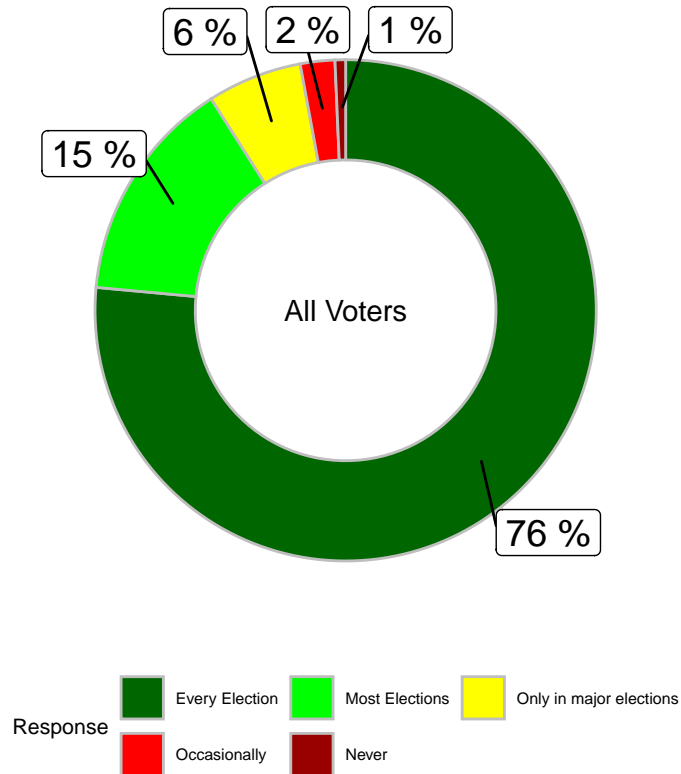

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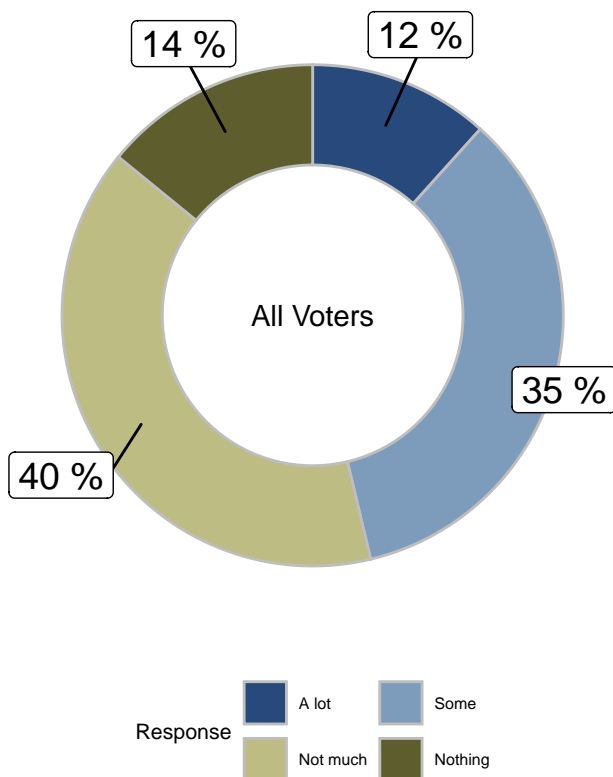

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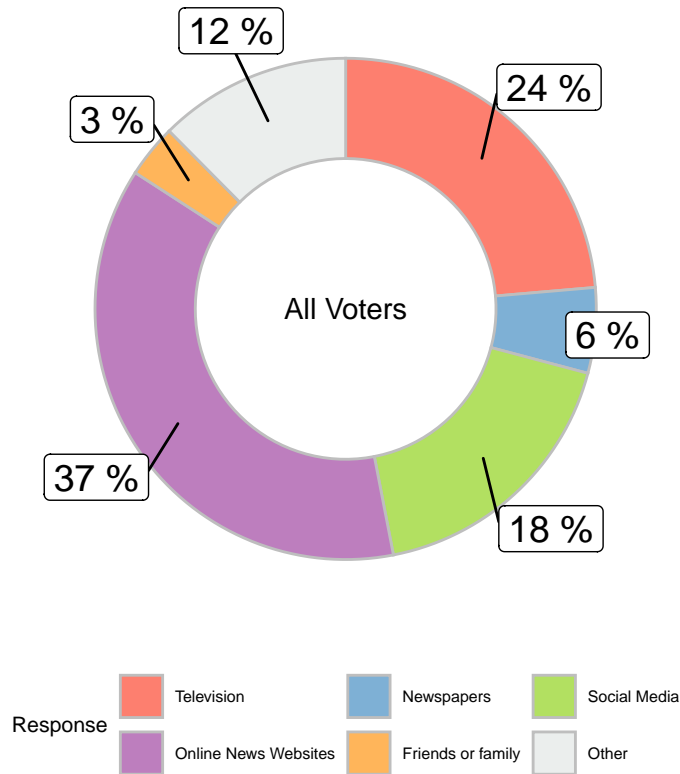
